Identifying the Major Moments of Your Novel

If jumping around from scene to scene in your first draft seems too daunting or overwhelming and you want a system with a little bit more order, consider this. Fill in the major moments of your novel.

For the sake of demonstration, here is what this system might look like for a story such as Cinderella.

• <u>The opening scene</u>

The king, having perceived his age, the state of his kingdom, and his unmarried son, decides to have a ball.

• plot point 1 scene

The Fairy Godmother, having outfitted the heroine with clothes and glass slippers, advises her to be back home by midnight.

• The scene at midpoint

Dancing with our heroine, the prince falls in love. Cinderella, in a swoon, forgets to mind the time.

- <u>plot point 2 scene</u> The clock strikes. The coach turns back into a pumpkin. Cinderella loses her slipper.
- <u>Climax (Catharsis Scene)</u> Cinderella braves the Wrath of the wicked stepmother to try on the shoe. It fits.
- <u>resolution</u> Her loyal subjects cheer the marriage of a new princess.
